The Blaster Siren is an effective safety tool for a variety of outdoor situations. The siren is a rechargeable personal audio deterrent that is an excellent alternative to traditional air horns. The siren produces 122dB of sound which makes it ideal for deterring wildlife.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Never point the Blaster Siren directly at another person or animal.
- ► Follow all charging instructions when charging the device

CHARGING INSTRUCTIONS

It is recommended that the Blaster Siren be discharged and recharged every three months when unused. Three months of non-use will result in battery level lowering to approximately 70% of full. This is only an estimate as climate can affect battery longevity. When charging the siren, the indicator light located on the bottom will be red, however, once fully charged the light will turn green. It is recommended that the siren be charged every 3 months to maintain maximum output. On a full charge, the Blaster Siren will provide approximately 30 minutes of continuous sound output.

The Blaster Siren is charged by pulling up the black tab at the bottom of the device and plugging in the USB to Micro USB cable into the port. **Only use one of the three following methods to charge:**

- 1. Use the USB to Micro USB cable along with the power port charger
- 2. Use the USB to Micro USB cable along with the outlet charger (1)
- 3. Use the USB to Micro USB cable and plug into 5 VDC such as a computer or vehicle (2)



LITHIUM BATTERY INSTRUCTIONS:

- Do not expose to fire or temperatures greater than 85°C/185°F
- Do not disassemble the battery
- Do not short circuit the battery
- Only use the charging units supplied with the product
- Never dispose of batteries in the garbage.
 Always take used batteries to your local battery-recycling center
